5 scenarios for the future





COLLAPSE



The brutal end of the thermo-industrial civilization leads to the disappearance of a part of the world population and a major societal regression. Several will be necessary for a new civilization to emerge from chaos.

TRANSHUMANISM



Our actions avoid a civilizational collapse, but the unreasoned use of technology leads to a dystopia that entrains humanity into centuries of alienation within a world controlled by a minority.

NEOHUMANISM



A collective awakening combined with scientific and societal advances allows the transition to a model of humanist society. However, the transition is partial, and some of the problems of the old world remain.

UTOPIA



The joint use of human development and technological progress leads to an ecological, learning, emancipated society, respectful of living beings, founded on selfesteem, the esteem of others, and nature.

TRANSCENDENCE



An extraordinary rise in consciousness leads to an unprecedented collective awakening and a transfiguration of reality through the use of creative thought. Humanity enters an era without limits.


